Adult Learning Opportunities

Greetings to all New Germany and area residents!

We would like to inform you of learning opportunities for adults who are 18 and older and no longer in school. Adult Learning Opportunities is located in Bridgewater, across from Giant Tiger (in the same building as Nova Scotia Works). We have been offering our services in Lunenburg County for more than 25 years, and have been pleased to include some of your residents as participants!

One such participant is New Germany resident Harold Whalen. Retiring after many years of working in construction and on automobiles, Harold needed something to do. As a self-taught mechanic who worked in various parts of Canada, he now wished to learn more. He discovered our Adult Learning Opportunities Program in Bridgewater, and has never looked back. Harold has been learning about computers and other technology. One example is sending messages to his family; another is using Facebook Marketplace. He is presently learning keyboarding skills. Harold has also received certification for a course that he recently took to pursue a personal goal. He was very pleased to have been given help when needed.



Our programs run from September till June, and new learners are welcome to join throughout the year. There is no cost for participants.

If you are thinking of continuing your education or improving your skills, we are here to help. We offer Levels One, Two, and Three (from elementary to approximately grade ten level) with a focus on Communications and Math. Level Four is offered at NSCC. This leads to your high school diploma. We

also help some adults prepare for the GED tests. Small in-class sessions are held daily around flexible schedules and individual tutoring is possible. On-line options are also possible. Beginner computer classes and other essential skills programs are held in the spring and fall.

We would be happy to meet with you, and to assess your abilities and needs.

NGRHS Egg Hatch

The Agriculture 11 class at New Germany Rural High School participated in a project to hatch chicken eggs at school recently. The incubator and twelve eggs were set up in Michael Wilson's classroom on April 22nd. The eggs were donated by Terri and Dwayne Foster. As the days went by, students helped monitor the eggs, candle the eggs to check for fertilization and growth, and to make sure the heat and humidity levels were ideal.

Unfortunately, when school was forced to lock down, the students were unable to continue the project in person. Mr. Wilson carefully moved the incubator using a power inverter to his home so the eggs could be



monitored and looked after. The Wilson girls, Clara, Audrey and Lydia were very excited to have the eggs at home and were fortunate to watch the chicks hatch and grow under the brood light. In the end, nine of the twelve eggs were fertilized and nine chicks hatched. Updates, photos, and videos were sent to students to keep them updated on the progress and once the chicks were growing nicely, they were sent to their new home in Stanburn.

Next year Mr. Wilson, students, and fellow staff hope

to do another hatching in the school. They are looking into the possibility of hatching some ducks as well. They also hope

to begin a new project for the school that will involve using students to build a chicken coop on site and eventually buy some laying hens by spring. Stay tuned for more information on this exciting project and learning experience for the students of NGRHS.


















River Ridge Common News



Reconnecting with Glen....Reconnecting with History

In 2007 Glen Veinot travelled to Dublin, Ireland on business and his Vice President of Operations, Derrick Bullock, showed him an Irish Stone Castle (probably built around 1200) and commented there was no structure that old in Canada.

That was a wake-up call that got Glen thinking about his community's history.

Two hundred years ago New Germany was basically wilderness with small bands of Indigenous people living peacefully. A few of the early European Protestant settlers who had arrived in Lunenburg in the 1750's had started to move inland along the LaHave River, but there was very little building going on until at least the early 1800's.

In 1999, Glen, with his wife, Anne-Marie, had travelled to Tyumen, Siberian Russia to adopt their daughter, Nikita. That's another whole story he'd be happy to tell you about! As part of that process Glen had started doing research on that Russian city, and was amazed at how much info he could find online.

Those two experiences in Ireland and Russia fueled his interest in the history of his local community, and his desire to see it shared.

He was hooked! Glen started researching the history of New Germany and how it became a village. It has taken him on an interesting path through old maps, old photos and land grants. His post secondary education as an electronic technician had trained him to troubleshoot and find faulty transistors, diodes and capacitors. Digging up history seemed similar to him. Always looking for something, one tangible, the other not so.



Meeting Nikita

Glen was born, raised, and took all his public schooling in New Germany graduating as the Class Valedictorian in 1983. He lived in New Germany until 1992 when he and Anne Marie married, at St John-in-the-Wilderness Anglican Church at the foot of New Germany Lake where some of the first European settlers would have lived almost 200 years earlier. Glen's father, Bruce, was born in New Germany in the house where Glen also grew up. Glen still owns all of his dad's property in New Germany.

Glen says, "My mother was born and raised in Shelburne County and had the ability to remember much of her childhood growing up and would often recite the 'good old days' but this would bore my father. My father never routinely spoke of the past but as a child I always had a million questions. He would always answer my questions in detail and if he did not know the answer, he would try and find the answer. When my father passed away in 2007 I became close to my godfather John Feindel. Our telephone conversations often revolved about history of New Germany and I was amazed on how much John knew and remembered and how much I was interested in it."

When asked about who he's in contact with to add to his information and who else he knows to be passionate about our communities' history, Glen explains, "Apart from stories my late father told me my biggest sources of information comes three sources: my godfather John Feindel, my friend Rosemary Rafuse (Penney), and my online friend Lloyd Varner. John Feindel was born in 1937, his mother was my grandfather's sister. John taught school in New Germany and has an excellent memory. Rosemary is also a retired school teacher and a book of knowledge. Her mother and grandmother passed many local stories down to her and she, like John, has an excellent memory. Lloyd was born in New Germany but moved away to work. He also has an excellent memory of his youth in New Germany. I credit all three of them for triggering my interest. Lloyd was the first person to tell me my Veinot Grandmother had red hair. I only had black and white photos of her."

On the New Germany website (newgermany.ca) there is a growing collection of pictures and information about the area history. Mary Wagner, who has complied a great deal of this, cites Glen as a frequent source of information and photos. Glen contributes a lot of the information and photos he gathers to his Facebook account as well and welcomes many 'friends' there.

Glen would encourage anyone interested in local history to start searching, asking questions. "The best way is to talk to your elders and then just start sourcing info any way you can by asking questions, searching the internet, understand how Google Advanced Search works, and how to use Government Databases. Genealogy is also good."

There are lots of stories to be uncovered, we have a rich local history. There've been (and still are) lots of interesting characters in our area! In recent years, as in the past 200+ years, many people from a wide variety of places and backgrounds have moved to the area, brought many interesting stories with them and lead full lives here. There are many stories yet to be heard. I encourage you to ask and listen.

When I asked Glen for one of his favorite stories, here's what he told me about the first cell phone call in the New Germany area. "One of my favourites was the day MT&T got cell phone service in Bridgewater during 1988. We worked hard a few weeks getting the equipment all working correctly in a small building on top of a hill outside Hebbyille. I drove around Bridgewater that day with a special phone measuring the signal strength and made sure the antennas where propagating correctly.

That evening I headed home to dad's house with the special phone with me. The system was not designed to serve New Germany, Bridgewater plus or minus 15km was the target. I wanted to be the first person to make a cell phone call to and from New Germany. I drove down the Osborne Road and parked in front of dad's 40 acre wood lot which is on the east side of the hill facing Bridgewater. The special phone had all kinds of signal so I initiated the call to dad's home phone. Dad answered and I remember him saying 'this thing is a lot clearer than that other thing you had that you can hear all over the scanner'.

I laughed and told him to now call me. I gave him the number but the Bridgewater cell phone exchange was now 527, not 543 so dad called the wrong number a few times only getting the last 4 digits correctly."

Should you meet Glen and ask him where he's from, "I always proudly say New Germany. I have the fondest memories of growing up, riding my bicycle all over New Germany, playing sports with my friends, school, our church, youth group, mowing lawns for the elderly, and hanging out with friends and family, either at their homes, or in front of the West End Esso. When I am asked my current postal code, I always have to think for a second as BOR1EO is etched in my mind. Hammond Plains is


