At that time, we had been

together for a couple of years. I cried and said yes and he gave me my ring. After I composed myself, we started the walk up the path to Gaff Point. After a few minutes, Scott said to me, "You know how we said if we ever married we would elope. He said I think our kids should be there (we each have two children ranging in age from 15 to 27). I said, "Of course...we wouldn't get married without them". He then turned to me and said, "Well your two kids and my two kids and a minister are at the top the hill if you want to get married today." Well, I started crying all over again. When I composed myself a little, I said yes and then looked down and said, "I wish I would have known; I would have worn something different." He said to me, "Don't worry...there is a wedding dress, flowers, shoes, jewelry and makeup up there for you and a sports coat, shirt and tie for me...if you want to get married today." All I could do

was cry again. We continued the walk and when we came to the clearing at the top of the hill, there were the four kids, a minister, our best friend with a video camera and my wedding dress hanging in a fir tree. My dressing room was behind that little fir tree. I got dressed, my son walked me down the path and gave me away, my daughter was my maid of honour, Scott's son and daughter were also there to witness this wonderful moment. It could not have been a more beautiful morning on the point.

I have told this story many times over the past years and people are always amazed that they could all keep this secret. The planning started in March and I had no idea at all. Wintertime and the gardens are all tucked up under a cozy white blanket of snow enjoying sweet dreams of warm summer days ahead. For gardeners it's a time of rest, renewal and anticipation. We are busy getting ready.

The first catalogues arrived around Christmas and there is a lot to choose from. A friend calls seed catalogues "porn" for gardeners. Peaches n' cream corn! Cylindra beets! Black Seeded Simpson lettuce! Rainbow carrot! Very Exciting! Very tempting! He may have a point about the catalogues............. and "Wait a minute! Look at those blueberry bushes!" The next thing I know I'm out back tramping around in the snow deciding where the new garden is going to go.

The New Germany Garden Club meets at the Community Centre the fourth Wednesday of each month and all are welcome. January 23rd we had the privilege of having high bush blueberry grower Myrtle Taylor as our guest speaker. Mrytle has been operating a successful blueberry U-pick in Barss Corner for many years. Her farm is a favorite place in the community every August when the blueberries are ripe and ready to harvest. Myrtle lead a lively question and answer session about blueberry growing for garden club members and visitors. The exceptional fact that Mrytle is able to lead a discussion on blueberry production at ninety- eight years of age must be mentioned. Thank you, Mrytle.

The garden club program for the February meeting will be companion planting. Planting with the understanding that some plants do not get along very well and others do. It will be a fascinating program.

Here is a valuable garden tip contributed by an experienced gardener and good friend. "The most important thing in the garden is the gardeners footsteps." Gardens, as with most things, do best when they get attention. I will add that you should plan your most demanding gardens be located where you most often travel. If you are frequently there you are far more likely to notice the weeds and pests and get after them immediately. You're more likely to be there to notice the hollyhocks blossom and the gold-finches gathering seeds of purple cone flower for their supper while you are gathering basil, chives, parsley or lettuce for your own. A 3'x5' garden right next to the kitchen door sometimes answers a person's gardening ambitions better than a 20'x40' garden out back. Happy Gardening!

Be the Peace...Make A Change

A Project of Second Story Women's Centre

Be the Peace... Make A Change is a 3-year project aimed at gathering communities, services, schools and government to end relationship violence in Lunenburg County. That's the ultimate goal... peace in relationships, peace in families, peace in schools, peaceful communities.

Many people are affected by violence in relationships, families, workplaces, schools -- women and men, girls, as well as boys. The New Germany community knows this well, having been deeply affected by the most serious kind of relationship violence in the death of Tina Mae Eisnor. Tina, unfortunately is not alone. Last year in Nova Scotia over 100 women were at high risk for being killed by their partners.

Be the Peace hosted a Public Forum in July 2012- over 150 people participated in asking, "How can we make Lunenburg County a safe place for all women, all children, all people?" Many conversations resulted in many ideas. "Start with children," many said. So we are working with the School Board, schools, teachers and guidance counselors to help young people understand and create healthy relationships and peaceful schools. We also have groups related to alcohol and violence, parenting and family support, arts and healing, church communities, a sexual assault response team, and also men exploring their role in preventing violence toward women and girls. All our meetings are open to anyone who would like to participate. (See the report at www.secstory.com/include/peace.htm).

Many people have shared their stories with us, stories of pain and also triumph. But so many more stories remain in the shadows, afraid to be told, afraid others will judge, afraid of threats and injury.

At Be the Peace we do not have the answers, but we do know that the answers lie in the community. And if we can have open conversations together, then we'll find the ways to end violence and create peace. **There is a group starting in New Germany to explore together.** Won't you join us? Family Fun in Winter

Winter is no time to hibernate, bundle up and head outside for some winter family fun! It is often difficult to come up with outside activities because of the short day light hours and chilly temperatures. Here are some ideas to get your family started.

The South Shore Annapolis Valley Trail runs right through our area. It is 122km long, running from New Germany, north to Bridgetown and west to Caledonia. Along the trail you will find numerous exit and entry points (with parking), plenty of wildlife and over 30 bridges. The trail has many recreational uses, such as walking, running, skiing, ATVs, snow mobiles and equestrian.

Lace up your skates and go to North River. There is a wonderfully constructed outdoor rink located at the North River Community Hall. All of the surrounding walls have been hand painted and sponsored by community members and local businesses. The rink was built in 2009 and is 50 feet by 100 feet. Take advantage of this free local gem.

Bill Flemming and Foard Robar offer horse and sleigh rides whenever there is snow on the ground. The cushiony sleighs are each pulled by two big, magnificent horses. Rides are ap-

proximately 45 minutes in length and explore the woods of Meisner's Section. There are room for up to 20 people and cost \$10 per person (under 12 are free). Please call Bill at 644 2476 to book your delightful sleigh ride.

If you are looking for outdoor activities to do in your own yard, here are a few suggestions:

- * When it is freezing outside, blow bubbles outside and watch how they freeze.
- * Fill a balloon with water and food coloring, leave it to freeze then peel off the balloon. You will have created beautiful colored ice balls.
- * Bring a large icicle inside. While a young child wears a glove, have them use it as a pen on construction paper and make designs and pictures.
- * Hold a snow melt contest. Have every one make a snowball and put it in a bucket, basin or dish. Bring it in the house and everyone places their bucket in a warm part of the home. See whose snowball turns to water the fastest.
- * Fill a squirt bottle with water and food coloring then go outside and paint the snow.

At last, there are always the classics: build a snowman or go tobogganing!

Connections Reflections with:

Annie Wynn

"These old eyes have seen a lot" As told by Annie Wynn to Alice Wile



The day had started out at -20 degrees, but when I stepped into the homey kitchen of Ann Wynn, we were up to a balmy +4. Ann led me into her comfortable living room where we chatted for the next hour and a half, ending our visit by sharing a pot of tea. Ann was born in Acaciaville, Digby County in 1922, and was the second oldest of six children born to farming parents. All her siblings are still living, and in reasonably good health. Her parents were strict Baptist's, but the home was always filled with love. She remembers plenty of chores for the children, and her least liked job was weeding the garden. They grew strawberries to sell and it was one of the chores for the children to keep the plants wed, and pick the berries when the time was right. The

winter months gave way to more time for children's games like coasting and skating, but Ann recalls that because of her strict Baptist home, there were no dances and no playing cards. She says her family was much like many others of that time. They didn't have a lot, but there was always enough. Home made bread and apple sauce was a common meal.

Acaciaville had it's own Black community and racial attitudes were prevalent. There was a church for the white people and a church for the black. A school for the white and a school for the black. Ann's parents employed a black boy to help with the farm work and she remembers his name was Levi. Ann also remembers a man in that community whom all the children called Uncle Pete. He was a story teller and somewhat of a pied piper as the children gathered around him whenever he sat down to tell a story. Another person from the black community that Ann remembers is a lady named Julie who got eggs from their farm, but never had money to pay for them. She later gave Ann's mother a crystal punch bowl which Ann says is a treasured family possession.

Ann attended the Acaciaville school until Grade 11 when she walked the three miles to Digby Academy. Ann was a studious girl and graduated from grade 12 before she was fifteen years old. Because she was too young to pursue her dream of becoming a nurse, she remained at home until her 19th birthday when she left home to begin her training at St. John General. She lived in residence with several other girls in pursuit of the same profession, and to this day stays in contact with two or three of these fellow nurses.

Ann met her husband, Eldon when he came to Digby from Truro, as a movie theatre manager. They began as friends and about the same time Ann left for St. John, Eldon joined the Air Force. In 1946 after five years in the Air force Eldon returned to Digby. Ann was then employed as a nurse at Digby General Hospital and had been promoted to the position of Administrator. Eldon and Ann were married in 1946 and came to New Germany where Eldon became a part owner of a small retail business with his cousin Ron Fielding. The building also housed a movie theatre, and with Eldon's experience as a theatre manager, he took over in that capacity. Eldon and Ann lived in an apartment over the store and theatre for thirteen years after which they built the home where Ann still resides on the Varner Road.

Eldon and Ann raised two girls and enjoyed a comfortable life. Ann speaks fondly of her husband who became ill and left her much too soon, saying that he was a wonderful husband and father.

Aside from her family and nursing, one of Ann's greatest accomplishments was the twenty-five years she

spent involved with the Girl Guide movement. She was instrumental in getting the New Germany unit of the Cancer Society off the ground, and gave between 30 and 40 years to that cause. For fifteen years she was a Sunday School teacher.


In summing up her story Ann says "these old eyes have seen a lot", but if she had her life to live over again, she would do exactly the same things. She tremendously enjoyed her career as a nurse, took great pride in her family and home, as well as her accomplishments in the community.

Since 1978 the Anglican, Baptist, Lutheran and United Churches in the area have joined together in support of this special project. All money raised goes to world development and relief projects.



Everyone is welcome to attend.


