### Simpson Corner

On Highway 208, between Hemford and New Germany, 6 kilometers west of New Germany, it was likely named for an early settler. It was initially called Ohio but was changed to avoid confusion with places of the same name in Shelburne and Yarmouth countries.

A Post Office was set up here on September 1, 1903. It closed briefly for four months on June 20, 1942 then remained open until finally closing on November 2, 1953. The first postmaster was James N. Hyson, succeeded by five other individu-



### Hemford

On Highway 208, six kilometers southwest of New Germany, some early grantees of land tracts in this area were settlers by the names of Solomon, Veinot and Rhodenizer.

The Post Office opened on October 1, 1878 and closed on November 14, 1953 with William Mailman as the first

Post Master. He was succeeded by Lawson Wile, Howard Wilfred Silver, Basil Pershing Wagner and Wallace Keith Mailman.



### Nineveh

On Highway 208 between Colpton and Hemford, 31 kilometers northwest of Bridgewater, the name has biblical origins from the ancient capital of the Assyrian Empire. Settled in the 1840's early landowners include Kaulbach (1842), Jacobs (1845), Campbell (1850) and Sheehan (1858).

The Post Office was authorized in 1913 and opened on July 1, 1914. It closed briefly on September 10, 1947 and then re-opened on February 15 1950 until finally closing on November 14, 1953. Postmasters were Arthur Lohnes and Mrs. Winnifred Veinot.



### Colpton

Twenty-seven kilometers northeast of Bridgewater between Nineveh and Pleasant River on Highway 208, this place was first called Pleasant River Settlement and changed when the Colp family obtained land in 1902.

The Post Office operated from April 1, 1916 until closing on November 14, 1953. Postmasters included Nathaniel Colp, Percy Melbourne Colp, Aubrey Lester MacKay, and Mrs. Gertrude Elzina Mac-Kay.

At 101 years of age, you might expect that Myrtle Taylor would be perfectly content to have others tend to her day-to-day needs. Quite the contrary, this independent, bright-eyed centenarian lives in the house she shared with her now deceased husband for over 70 years in Barss Corner. She spends her days baking bread, preparing her own meals and when she is not doing that, she is out walking her dog Safire!

In mid October, ElderDog volunteers visited with Myrtle and among other things discussed what the secrets to her long life might include.

She attributes her longevity to a life well-lived, eating three meals a day prepared from wholesome food grown on their farm and always getting a good night's sleep. "We always lived a clean life", she adds. "We raised Jersey cows and hens here for many years". And in the winter, there was wood



"We always had a dog", she added. Growing up in Bakers Settlement, she remembers the family pet going off with her father to perform chores around their farm. "He would go out to chop wood in the winter and the dog always went with him. He would take his jacket off so the dog had something to lie on in the snow until he was finished, then they would come home." Even back then, their dog lived in the house and was a valued member of the family. And there has been a long succession of much-loved dogs over the years. "I can't ever remember not having a dog", she recalls.

So when Myrtle's elderly sheltie died earlier last year, her granddaughter made sure that it was not long before Myrtle had another canine companion. Recognizing that she might need some help, her granddaughter also contacted ElderDog to assist Myrtle in the care of her new furry friend, Safire who arrived in August of 2016. Since then ElderDog volunteer Lynn Frail visits three to four times per week with Myrtle and takes Safire out for a long walk. Myrtle always has the teakettle on when Lynn returns. "She's easy to get along with," Myrtle adds with a chuckle. Having regular visits from Lynn ensures that Safire gets the care she needs and Myrtle obviously enjoys the visits as well. It seems like Safire's care has spawned a great friendship between the two women, who both enjoy a good joke and some gentle ribbing of each other.

And six year old Safire seems to have settled right in. The fluffy grey Shih Tzu cross seems devoted to Myrtle and loves to share the big comfortable chair in the living room with her. "She sleeps on my bed every night too", Myrtle adds. Each morning, Safire and Myrtle go out for a little walk around the grounds surrounding the old farmhouse, to enjoy the fresh air.

As for turning 101, Myrtle shrugs off any suggestion that she is remarkable. "You learn to cope with what comes your way," she adds. "It's no good to complain. Who wants to listen to that? Attitude is every-thing!" she adds affirmatively, giving Safire a gentle pat on her head.

## A Grand Ol' Hobby

We all have a hobby. For some it is scrap-booking, photography, painting or model car building. Others it can be a bigger one like woodworking, car racing, rebuilding classic cars and trucks, or restoring antique tractors. As some may know, Owen Turner does have a couple of hit and miss engines and he too has a hobby on the go. In the community of West Northfield Owen collected, stored and has on display his very cool collection of model trains. This collection is grand in size, has been locked away in the basement of his home "up on the hill", where he and wife Olive raised their three children. Owen's model train collection has also been a hit with his grandchildren. When asked about how the family felt about his hobby he said "Olive thinks it is wonderful and my grandson Jason was quite impressed".

When I asked Owen "when did this all get started," he took me back 27 years ago, to Bangor, Maine where he found and purchased his first two steam engines. Now these two steam engines are special to the train community. This is because they both have four steam motors. They were designed to give more power when rolling up and over the hills and mountains. Since then he has collected enough engines, passenger cars, oil and wood chip carriers and cabooses to complete 30 train sets. This collection fills most of Owen's basement and his passport, as Owen has travelled to the States and across Canada to find his trains. Owen has bought local too, at the former Wings and Wheels in Blockhouse. Most of his collection is HO scale but he does have some S scale.

Over 27 years Owen has collected unique trains and accessories and, with some local help, he has been able to create one of the best model train displays that I have ever seen. Some people might have seen similar displays in history or train museums. Owen and his helpers have really put together a display that highlights the mountains, valleys, and industries, that show generations like mine, what a community looked like with trains running through the back fields into the towns. Looking at the tiny village that

Owen has on display started me thinking about New Germany and what it might have looked like with the train still running. I asked Owen if he had any model trains that would have run through New Germany and his reply was "Right over here!" Owen has found two trains that were specific to New Germany's history. They are engines, one being a stream engine and the second a Diesel engine, both roared through the village. Back in the day when trains rolled through the towns and villages, Owen was right there too. Owen worked for the railway for a short period of time. So I asked Owen if seeing the "big trains" travel, fueled his interest for collecting these mini look-a-likes. His reply, "No".

And I am sure that Owen will be open to welcoming new visitors as the pictures shown on these pages just do not do the trains justice compared to the real thing.

I was not the first to stop by Owen's to check out his collection. Owen has had visitors stopping by since 1999, only nine years after starting his little hobby. Since than they have come from as far as New Zealand and as local as West Northfield.

# Cycling in the New Germany Area

Every year, more than 40,000 tourists come to Nova Scotia to cycle, many visiting rural parts of our province that tourists travelling in cars or buses do not tend to see. Nova Scotians visit other parts of the province to cycle too – the South Shore is a favourite and frequent destination of Halifax cycling groups.

Cycling - whether for sport, commuting to work or for leisure - benefits health, the environment and the economy. Canadian studies have found that tourists who cycle spend an average of \$990 per trip, including \$150 a day on food and drinks. Over half of cycling tourists take trips lasting 2 or more days, so use local accommodations when they travel. Bicycle sales shops, rental companies, repair services, and tour companies, restaurants, coffee shops and grocery stores, campgrounds, motels and Bed and Break-fasts are some of the businesses that benefit from cycling tourism.

Nova Scotia has been promoting, encouraging and investing in cycling. Municipal programs such as the Halifax Bike Friendly Certification Program encourages businesses to support cycling with bicycle parking and policies that allow cyclists to park cars, fill up water bottles and use washrooms without purchase and Nova Scotia's Share the Road campaign reminds all of us that our *Motor Vehicle Act* gives cyclists the same rights to use roads as other vehicles and requires motor vehicles to give 1 metre of clearance when passing cyclists.

Routes for cycling and other active transportation include the \$40-million-dollar *Blue Route*, a continuous 3,000 km network of roads and trails circling the province, the nearly complete *LaHave River Trail* that comes through New Germany, linking the South Shore with the Annapolis Valley, and the *South Shore Annapolis Trail*, linking New Germany with Caledonia and Bridgetown.

Route maps to help cyclists who come to Nova Scotia decide where to cycle are produced by cycling as-

sociations such as Cycle Nova Scotia and local governments such as the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg. Experienced cyclists also use web tools such as Map My Ride to show other cyclists their favourite routes.

That the New Germany area, with beautiful scenery and low traffic, has great potential as a cycling destination may be a well-kept secret. For example, the Cornwall Road has been described as a one of Nova Scotia's most spectacular places to cycle, but does not appear on a cycling route map, or at least one that is easy to find.

The purpose of this article is to encourage New Germany area cyclists to map their rides, business owners to post bike-friendly signs and all of us to think about the health, environment and economic benefits to our area of promoting and encouraging cycling. Ideally, future articles will feature New Germany area mapped routes showing trips – perhaps 25 km, 50 km, 75 km, 100 km loops - out from main trails, noting route type and difficulty, how long trips trips trips are available.

South Shore Helping Hands is continually offering training sessions for those interested in becoming volunteers. The more people involved, the more varied skills and time can be offered to the people in the community. You can volunteer as much or as little time as your lifestyle allows.

Examples of assistance offered are:

- Household tasks (not regular cleaning) including light yard work
- Certain minor interior / exterior repairs
- Delivery of groceries and medications from local stores
- Visits / companionship
- Delivery of VON meals
- Pick up of Red Cross equipment rentals

We can accept requests for assistance by the individual, by family members who live afar, health care professionals, the local Seniors Safety Coordinator, and church pastors.
