New Germany and Area Medical Centre

A medical pillar in our community

If you are lucky enough to be a resident of the neighborly community of New Germany, chances are you know that at the end of a residential street in the heart of the town, you'll find the New Germany and Area Medical Centre. Although many residents know the medical centre is tucked cozily at the end of Varner Road, many may not know the history of how the community pulled together to make the idea of a rural medical centre a reality.

Did you know?...

- •The New Germany and Area Medical Centre fundraising sign was erected at the site of the centre in April of 1993 and by December of the same year, the community and partners raised \$100,000.
- •The land the medical centre sits on was donated by New Germany residents Rollie and Pat Smith with sod turning June of 1993.
- •The building was designed by New Germany resident Greg Varner.
- •Community member, Bill Alexander, acted as Project Manager and construction of the centre began on July 6, 1993.
- •On August 14, 1993 the first shingle was laid at 9:30 a.m. and the last at 2:30 p.m. with 111 bundles of shingles used to complete the job.
- •The centre was completed on October 30, 1993.

As the building was funded and erected by volunteers, it is also maintained by a volunteer Board of Directors. 2020 Waste Collection Changes

Starting April 1: Two Bulky landfill items will be collected every two weeks on your regular pickup day. Collectable items include: Couches, mattresses, box springs, rugs, upholstered chairs, vacuum cleaners, plastic furniture, toilets, sinks and windows. Wood and metal will be picked up in fall only.

Fall 2020: Wood and Metal Collection will take place once a year during a two-week period, on your regular pickup day. Check your 2020 Waste Collection Calendar. Collectable items include: wooden furniture, wooden doors, pallets, boards, barbecues, washing machines, dryers, stoves, metal furniture. Drop off de-humidifiers, freezers and fridges at 908 Mullock Road, Whynott's Settlement for free. Gases will be drained from appliances. Do not put roadside unless drained and stickered. Wood and metal items will not be collected every two weeks with bulky landfill waste.

Two trucks will collect your waste. One truck will take garbage, bulky landfill items and empty green carts. Another truck will take recyclables, paper and cardboard. Place waste roadside by 7:00 am.

The construction will be beginning in the early spring.



Reconnecting with the Weavers

~An interview with Catherine Robar who taught with both Weavers!

From the time she started school in Gabarus, Cape Breton, Sandra (Sandi) MacGillivray always wanted to be a teacher. At the opposite end of the province, a young Kevin Weaver, growing up in Barrington Passage, was thinking the same thing. Their dreams brought them together to Nova Scotia Teachers' College in 1969, where Sandi and Kevin later met, and where Kevin, interestingly enough, shared a room with another young aspiring teacher, Barry Conrad, from New Germany.

After Teachers' College, Kevin went to St. Mary's University to complete a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Biology and a minor in Paleontology which he would need to be able to teach at the High School level. They were married in 1972, and lived in a married student apartment at SMU while Kevin studied and Sandi taught at Porter's Lake. In 1973, Sandi was offered a job at Hebbville Elementary, Kevin was offered a job at New Germany Rural High, and roommates (Barry & Kevin) became colleagues.

Mr. Weaver continued at NGRH for the next 33 years, teaching General Sciences, Geography, Biology and Computer. Kevin coached badminton, taught Driver Education and for many years was staff advisor for many Grad committees. His entire teaching career was spent here in New Germany and he retired in 2004.



After a year at Hebbville, Sandi began substituting at New Germany Elementary and then began a full-time position teaching Primary and One. After a few more years she moved to a Grade Four classroom, which became the grade level she most enjoyed. Teaching was interesting and challenging, and rewarding on so many levels. Sandi enjoyed her days with her students, appreciated the support and involvement with their parents, and made life long friends among the staff. Sandi was corresponding secretary of the NSTU Local for many years.

The Weavers first lived in a Bridgewater apartment then in a Fielding & Wynn apartment, before buying their home on the Old Barss Corner Road. They loved the country setting, where they enjoyed gardening and raising turkeys, chickens and pigs and Kevin puttered happily in the workshop and yard. Their neighbours, Gary and Laura Lee Seamone, enjoyed a shared path across the field which linked their yards. Their arrangement worked well as neighbours helped each other and shared many social and family times. Kevin used the snow blower in the winter and Gary mowed in the summer to keep their path always open! Kevin served the community as a Volunteer Firefighter, and was instrumental in encouraging his neighbour, Gary, to do the same.



Their home was the site of many happy memories there raising their two daughters, Andrea and Janet. Both girls attended New Germany Elementary and graduated from New Germany Rural High School.

When Kevin and Sandi became 'empty nesters', they decided it was time to find a new home. Kevin was still teaching here when they moved to Bridgewater where they are now enjoying their retirement years. They keep in touch with many friends, staff members, and former students and have a large Facebook community. Life is full and busy for the Weavers. Sandi enjoys knitting, scrapbooking and card making; Kevin ties fishing flies, and dabbles in carpentry on his own and with his grandson; they make a trip south every winter to enjoy the beaches, and the warm sun.

They consider themselves so fortunate that their daughters both live in the province, and they are able to spend time with their three grandchildren. They both continue in good health.

Whenever they are out and about, wherever they travel, they are delighted when someone who calls out a friendly hello to 'Mr. Weaver'.... and a bit less often to 'Mrs. Weaver'.... seems it's easier to seems it's easier to remember those high school teachers than the ones who

A Small Change

In 2016 the 4H club approached us with the idea of hosting a Christmas Tree Forest as part of Country-side Christmas, but they needed a place where power would be available. Main Street Maples seemed like the ideal place to light up over the Christmas holidays.

All the trees had energy efficient LED lights, using **402 kilowatts**, the power bill being paid by NGAPS. The Christmas trees were lit 24/7 during this time. NGAPS requested the 4H club put timers on the trees so instead of being lit all day (who even knows the Christmas lights are on in the daytime?), that they be on for 6 to 8 hours in the evening starting at sunset.

In 2018 the Christmas Tree Forest used **134 kilowatts**, even though there were more trees. That is the difference the timers made to the power usage!

Sometimes it is the small changes that make a big difference in our use of energy. While it probably won't be small changes which halt global warming and climate change, if we make enough of them maybe it will help.



In Memory of Lion Valerie Gardiner


In December, 2019, the New Germany & Area Lions Club lost one of its cherished members-Lion Valerie Gardiner.

Sewer Rate Reduction

~Sarah Kucharski, Communications Officer, MODL A reduction in the sewer tax rate is on the way for residents of New Germany.

Five years ago, Council approved area rates for municipally run sewer systems with a subsidy from the general tax rate of up to \$0.03 per \$100 of assessment. This rate structure was based on identifying the full costs of operating the municipal sewer systems, generating revenue through area rates for sewer, and providing up to \$0.03/\$100 assessment of general rate revenue in recognition of the environmental and economic development benefits of the systems. Council agreed that rates would be reviewed every five years.

Before the five years were up, the Municipality reviewed the rate and determined that the rates set were higher than required based on declining loan interest costs that were not anticipated in the original model. In 2017/2018 rates were reduced by \$0.02 to \$0.73/\$100 assessment for properties located in New Germany, Conquerall Bank, Cookville and Shore Drive.

This fall, staff recalculated costs and revenue for another five-year cycle and presented three options to Municipal Council based on the same principles and approaches as the original model.

Municipal Council approved the proposed Sewer Rates of \$0.43/\$100 assessment for those in New Germany, Conquerall Bank, Cookville and Shore Drive, effective April 1, 2020. This is a 41% reduction in the Area Sewer Rate.

Helis on Ice



Christie and Jeremy Dann started hosting Helis (and other flying machines) On Ice 10 years ago at their cottage on Kill Dog Cove, Sherbrooke Lake. Mid-February tends to be a challenging time weather and ice condition wise and we have actually been able to pull it off 7 times, often with multiple date changes. In the early days it was just for RC helicopter flyers but has expanded to include all types of RC flying machines. Up until last year it was for Radio Jeremy's interest has expanded and with a return to full size Controlled pilots.

aviation it was a natural extension to invite fellow full scale pilots who either drive or fly their own plane

or helicopter into the event. The Wings of Wellington RC club and the Bluenose Flying Club have been very supportive of Helis on Ice. It is a nationally sanctioned event now and insured through the Model Aeronautics Association of Canada.

New Oil & Glycol Recycling Program

A new Oil and Glycol Recycling Program started in January 2020.

Accepted: used oil filters, used oil, ethylene or propylene glycol

(antifreeze) and diesel exhaust fluid containers of 50 litres or less and aerosol containers for automotive parts cleaners and aerosol lubricants.

Items will be banned from landfill as of March 1, 2020. Drop items off at the Lunenburg Regional Community Recycling Centre, 908 Mullock Road, Whynott's Settlement. Garages can register for on-site collection. Antifreeze and oil jugs 20 L or less will still be accepted in the blue bag (with cap on).
