



Clear skies and warm temperatures prevailed on the afternoon of September 27th as the community of New Germany and surrounding area gathered under the maples for what is hoped will become an annual community picnic. Approximately seventy people of all ages gathered bearing plates, pots and bowls of delicious food. Children delighted in riding the Lions' train with Roger Carver as the Conductor, as well as participating in a nature scavenger hunt, playing games and face painting. Meanwhile adults positioned their lawn chairs in groups for catching up with friends and neighbours. The New Germany Volunteer Fire Department opened its doors for those young and old to tour the facility and check out the new Fire Rescue Command Vehicle recently purchased by the department. Following the pot luck supper, no one could resist ending the day with ice cream provided by the Promotion Society.

The beautiful maples that grow along main street, providing colours in the fall and shade in the summer, were originally planted by Jacob Francis Penney in 1924, great grandfather of the Penneys who now live in the community. When several of the maples died off, Mr. Penney replaced them with ash trees.

Last year the New Germany Area Promotion Society spearheaded a project to build a community garden along this section of Highway 10 under the maples. The project is known as the Main Street Maples and many local residents have taken the initiative to provide improvements. I'm sure you have noticed the beautiful flower gardens, park benches, picnic tables, birdhouses and neatly mown grass.



All of this is a wonderful example of how New Germany residents continue to work hard and show pride in this beautiful community.

New Germany was built on hard work and determination, but once the work is done for the day, celebrations with food, games and socializing solidify that work is a product of an entire community. The community picnic was more than just a fun event, it gave families a time to reflect on how our community has changed over the years. True, there were booming times in New Germany, but as a young person who has grown up in this community, I believe we are still booming in a different way. We may not have a movie theatre or department stores, but we have a community of hard working, caring, thoughtful people who don't think twice about helping a neighbour in need, volunteering in the community or giving someone a much deserved pat on the back. River Ridge Common

If you've picked up the first edition of the Trail Maps brochure published by the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg you will have seen that River Ridge Common, our outdoor recreation park at Civic Address 4668 Highway 10 near New Germany, has now officially arrived! The brochure includes a full description of its location and features as well as information for safe and enjoyable multi-use of this developing property.

MODL's Recreation Department and the River Ridge Common Committee are pleased to announce that the entrance and lower parking lot off Highway 10 are completed as well as a scenic new multi-use uphill switchback trail that accesses the junction of the South Shore Annapolis Valley (SSAV) Trail. Both of these phases of park development have been completed by local contractors through our advertised and open contracting process with excellent results.

You will find the largest area of the River Ridge Common property beyond the SSAV Trail junction – hilly, partially treed, with a system of overgrown woods roads. Please be aware that these trails are currently in a heritage path condition and are not open to motorized vehicles so that we can prevent further erosion or damage of the site.


We are very excited about the next planned phases of trail development and grooming as well as enhancing your outdoor experience with appropriate information and direction signage. The Municipality will be advertising to have a detailed site plan developed and work will begin in the spring on the first stages.


International Students @ NGRHS

The are often many changes in the business community in our area. This column will note the highlights.


There are several new businesses in the New Germany area.

New Germany Volunteer Fire Department

The New Germany Volunteer Fire Department recently purchased a new fire vehicle. The truck committee met for over a year to determine their long range plan for vehicle replacement and alignment. They concluded that the most urgent need was for a Fire Rescue Command Unit. This recommendation was unanimously accepted by the members of the department.

They chose Rocky Mountain Phoenix in Bridgewater to build the new truck. Built on a diesel powered Ford F350 4x4 chassis with aluminum cap and bed slide, this truck provides rugged versatility. Some additional features include a well lit Code 3 lighting package, dual tone Code 3 banshee siren, Iron cross heavy duty bumper with brush guard and 12,000 pound winch.

The unit has immediately proven to be an asset to the department. The unit was used to transport fire-fighters to standby during the September fire at the Pellet factory and on a lift assist in early October. Previously a fire fighting unit would be taken out of service to complete these tasks.

NGVFD serves with the best interests of the community in mind.

There will be no meeting in December but our meetings will resume on January 27th with our AGM at 7:00pm. Check the community website for program details. Everyone is welcome to attend.


