Girl Guides of Canada are 100 Years old!

The roots of the Girl Guide/Girl Scout Movement go back to the early days, when its extraordinary founder, Robert Baden-Powell started the Boy Scout Movement. In 1909, Baden-Powell called a rally in London, England for the Boy Scouts. A group of daring girls showed up and when he realized the number of girls that wanted to join he gave them the name Guides. He asked his sister Agnes to take charge of the girls and she is referred to as the "Grandmother" of Guiding. When he married, his wife Olave joined him and they were named the World Chief Scout and Guide.

In 1910 Guiding came to Canada and in 1911 it took root in Nova Scotia. That is 100 years ago! The Guiding program was introduced in New Germany in 1955 by a school teacher Greta Gatchell. However, it began in earnest in 1958 under the direction of Ruby Stewart. The Brownie program began a year later with Dorle Weiland and Ann Wynn as its leaders. In 1963 the first Land Ranger Unit was begun under the direction of Alice Cole. In 1979 the Pathfinder unit was started (we are currently seeking information as to who this first leader was) and in 1991 the Spark Unit was started under the direction of Jane (Veinot) Varner. These ladies started the various Units but since then we have had many dedicated leaders, volunteers and community support who have kept the program active and alive. We have been supported by Epworth United Church since 1958.

From the unprecedented action of a handful of girls a century ago, Guiding has grown into the largest organization for girls and women with a membership of over 10 million in 145 countries. The Guiding Program makes a positive difference in the life of every girl and woman who experiences Guiding so she can pursue personal goals and commitments to our communities, to our country and to our planet. It enables girls to be confident, resourceful and courageous and to make a difference in the world. While the world has changed drastically over the last century, Guiding has remained true to its ideals as a dynamic organization, changing with the times to reflect the needs and interests of today's girls and women.

This year we hope to continue offering the benefits of this program to the girls in the New Germany Area but to do this we desperately need volunteers to be leaders. South Shore Regional School Board

SSRSB will be hosting a meeting at the West Northfield Elementary School on Wednesday, September 29th from 7:00p.m. - 9:00p.m. to discuss grey areas with existing school boundaries in the area. SSRSB is reviewing areas from which students are attending more than one school.

The meeting will begin with an introduction and presentation, followed by a Q&A period for parents and community members. The following options will be presented on a handout with space for people to write comments and hand in if they do not feel comfortable addressing a crowd. They will also be sent home with students for parents who can not attend the meeting.

Option Areas (Students in these areas presently have the choice to attend either New Germany Rural High or Park View Education Centre) :

1. From Bridgewater Town Limits, to and including, the Bruhm Road along Highway 10 (including Pine Grove)
2. From Bridgewater Town Limits, to and including the Bruhm Bridge along the Lower Branch Road (including Turner Heights subdivision).

There are currently 104 students in this area attending New Germany Rural High and 19 students in these areas attending Park View Education Centre.

There are three choices being considered by SSRSB and they include:

Option #1: All students attend Park View Education Centre with students being grandfathered into the school they currently attend.

Option #2: All students attend New Germany Rural High School with students being grandfathered into the school they currently attend.

Option #3: Maintain the status quo., i.e. students continue to have the choice of which school they attend.

Everyone is welcome to attend the meeting.

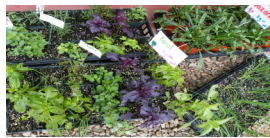

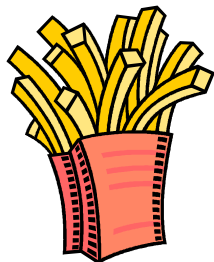
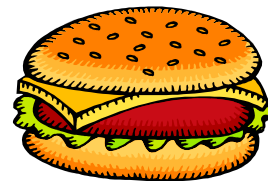

Recipe

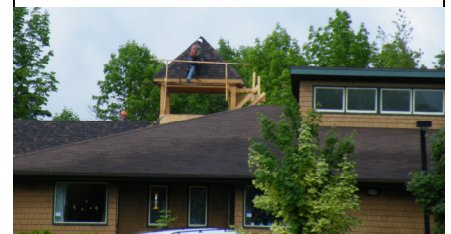

1/2cup granulated sugar	1 ¾ cups oatmeal
¼ cup brown sugar, packed	1 ¼ cups raisins
2 eggs	1 apple cored, peeled and shredded
1 ½ cups flour	½ cup sweetened, shredded coconut
1tsp. baking powder	

Grease baking sheets. In large bowl with electric mixer, mix together shortening, peanut butter, granulated and brown sugars. Add eggs, beating until fluffy. Add flour, baking powder, baking soda and cinnamon and mix until combined. Stir in oatmeal, raisins, apple and coconut. Drop by ¼ cup measure onto prepared baking sheets. Bake in a 350 F oven for 17 to 20 minutes or until light golden brown. Let cool for 2 minutes and then remove to cooling rack. Makes 25 large cookies.

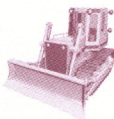

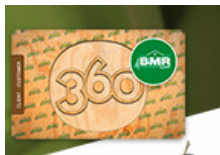

NG & Area Arts & Crafts Association

"The New Germany and Area Arts and Craft Association was formed on April 12th, 1979. One suspects that the actual beginning was in May of 1976 when the class instructors in the New Germany Continuous Education Program, and their adult students put on an evening of "Show and Tell". At that time they displayed their results from booking keeping, sewing, crocheting, typing, carpentry and painting courses.

Both events attracted a surprisingly large number of spectators.

With the aid of a grant from the Department of Education, it was decided to hold a Saturday event, incorporating the Continuous Education finale, the now hard working Rosedale Senior Citizens Club, community organizations and any local craft persons. It was labeled the Mini Arts and Craft Show and Sale, held May 6th, 1978. The New Germany High School Gym became the venue to showcase the event. Hundreds came to see and to buy. On October 21st, 1978 the first annual Christmas Show and Sale was held at the local high school. The response was so great from the number of sellers and buyers that there could be no other way but to hold biannual shows. On March 12, 1979 steps were taken to form an association. At the April 12th, 1979 meeting the first president, Fern Selig, led the proceedings for the spring show. An executive of four was empowered to lead the organization. Ten representatives were appointed from the environs surrounding New Germany. The New Germany and Area Arts and Craft Association sponsored their first show on May 26th, 1979. From 1976 to 1979, Keith Trimper was the convener for the shows. This task was made easier by the assistance of Randy Crozman - Vice President and Fern Selig. In 1980 Fern Selig convened the shows and in 1981-1982 Paul Chase undertook the task. In June of 1981 Bill Alexander became the second president.

The Association was registered and legally incorporated in January of 1982. The constitution under which the organization functions was adopted in June of 1980. The purpose of the New Germany and Area Arts and Craft Association is outlined in the constitution and reads as follows:

- (a) To preserve the past, the present and future arts and craft heritage of this regions culture.
- (b) To promote interest in the various forms of art and craftsmanship in New Germany and Area.
- (c) To provide skills for the association members and the general public in the many forms of Arts and Crafts.
- (d) To attract to the association new members who are interested in these purposes.

The Association encourages the "little person" to participate in the shows and sales by keeping cost to a minimum. It is the feeling that the crafts persons who make a few articles, and desires to exhibit them, frequently gives the show that distinctive difference that makes our biannual events unique. We encourage community groups to become involved as well.

The Association has come a long way since 1979. We aim to please the exhibitors, but more importantly, we aim to please you....the public. Public support has propelled the association this far. We look forward to the future with confidence."

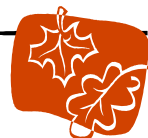
