

New Germany Rural High School 2nd Annual IWK Toy Drive

From the beginning of the school year until November 30th, NGRHS will be running a toy drive for the patients and their families at the IWK. The toys will be donated as part of a program organized by the hospital called "Operation Snow Pile". This program allows parents and guardians to pick from donated toys to give to their sick children spending Christmas at the IWK. Donated toys must be good quality, new, unopened and unwrapped. Toys and donations should be for children aged newborn to late teens. Toys that are not used at Christmas will be distributed throughout the year as young patients visit the IWK for treatment, surgery or other procedures.

Aside from toy donations, gift cards of small amounts (\$5, \$10, \$15 or \$20) will be accepted to help the parents/guardians staying with their children. These cards could be for places such as: Tim Hortons, Subway (both located in the IWK), McDonalds, Walmart, or gas stations.

All donations can be dropped off to teacher Michael Wilson at New Germany Rural High School. If possible, please leave your name with your donation so Mr. Wilson can record your donation. If you are unable to deliver your donation, feel free to call Mr. Wilson at the school (902) 644-5000 or email him at mrwilson@gnspes.ca to arrange possible pick up.

The toy drive began last year after the Wilson's newborn daughter Lydia was rushed to the IWK from the South Shore Regional Hospital. She was struggling to breathe due to a condition called RSV. With the

knowledge and expertise of the amazing nurses and doctors, Lydia survived and is now a healthy and happy little girl. While in hospital, Christmas was





Reconnecting with the Taylor Family

Strange how an event, decision or experience can have such far-reaching effects in our lives and the lives of so many others. Who would guess that a ship being torpedoed in the Atlantic during the war could set off a chain of events that would result in our community benefitting from our years with the Taylors? Don and Sharon Taylor moved to their home on the Varner Rd, or Legion Rd as it was called then, in New Germany in 1976 after a few years renting a farmhouse on the Watford Road.

Let's take their story back to Don's father, William, during WWII, sailing from Scotland across the Atlantic heading to Stanford University in California to study medicine. The ship was torpedoed! Two of the other three young men travelling with him were killed. He was brought to Halifax for a few weeks while arrangements were made to continue on to California. Halifax hospitality made a huge difference in his life!

He did study medicine, and he met Jean who had come from Hawaii to study in California; they married and moved to Scotland where Don was born. Some years later, there was an opportunity to work in Nova Scotia's health system, and the family, which now included 4 sons and a daughter, moved to Halifax. Don met Sharon Tufts in their senior year of High School but they drifted apart after graduation in 1963. In 1965 they reconnected after a chance meeting in a Montreal train station. They made plans to see each other back in the Valley where Sharon was by then working as a Dental Hygienist and Don was finishing up his degree at Acadia. They married in 1967 and lived in Wolfville while Don finished his B.Ed. They moved to Port Alberni BC where he taught Grade 10 English and Sharon worked in dentistry. Don was quickly discouraged by the education system when among other things, he wasn't allowed to offer extra help to students with low reading levels. By Christmas, he was ready to move back to NS, where he finished the year teaching at Horton High in the Valley. The next move was to Halifax in 1970 where he studied law and Sharon worked for the Dept of Health.

Don's father, by then a pathologist in the Valley, had met a young lawyer, named David Walker, who was looking for someone to work with him in his law practice in New Germany. It seemed a good match, and in 1973, Don and Sharon moved to the area with their two young daughters, Jana, born in 1971, and Allison, born in 1973. They settled well into the community, working hard, making friends, becoming involved in school and community activities, and their family expanded with the birth of Paul in 1978.

Sharon, while being a busy young mom, also worked in her husband's law office, and for a time with Dr Creaser in the local dentist's office. While in New Germany many people met Sharon through her wide involvement in the community. She was instrumental in establishing, along with several other young parents, the Co-operative Nursery School which operated for over 25 years, first at the Legion Hall and then at the Anglican Church Hall. Sharon volunteered in many capacities as their children went through

school at New Germany Elementary and Junior High, and Park View, and her concern for our children's education led her to run successfully for School Board where she served as Board Chair for several years. For four years she was President of the Bridgewater Hospital Auxiliary. Brought up in the Anglican Church in the city, Sharon soon became involved in St John's Anglican Church where she helped out with everything from teaching Sunday School, to helping at church suppers and our Christmas Tea, to cleaning the church, to serving in leadership as Church Warden. She was also involved in the local Scout Movement as a Beaver leader.



Don, who met hundreds of people while serving the local community through his busy law practice, also was an active member of the Fire Department, and Chair of the Board which worked to bring the Rosedale Home for Special Care to our community.

The Taylors left New Germany in 2001 and followed a very interesting path. First, they sailed to the Caribbean and then back to Lunenburg. From 2002-2007 they lived in Kentville where Don again practiced law and began work with Title Insurance Company. His work with Title Insurance took them to Vancouver where they lived until 2011. The next move took them to Hawaii where they lived close to Don's sister, Ann, and his brother, Ali.

Earlier this year, they moved again to be close to family. This time the desire to be close to family brought them back to Canada. Don and Sharon have settled, for now, in Calgary, near their children and grandchildren who all live in Alberta!


