Wooden Whistles

Whistles have been around since early humans first carved out a gourd or branch and found they could make sound with it. Many present day wind



instruments are inheritors of these early whistles. With the rise of more mechanical power, other forms of whistles were developed.

One characteristic of a whistle is that it creates a pure, or nearly pure, tone. The conversion of flow energy to sound comes from an interaction between a solid material and a fluid stream.

New Germany Rural High School Garden Project

This past March we decided to try a school garden at New Germany Rural High School. I wanted to start this garden to show our students the process of growing your own food and to hopefully provide some food that we can use in our school cafeteria.

Planning began with school administration and interested teachers meeting to discuss our vision and to draw up plans. It was decided that Trevor Kendall's Construction Technology 11 students would build our raised beds while Kat Creaser's O2 and my Agriculture 11 students (along with many other student volunteers from different grades) would start seeds, prep the site, and plant the crops. Kelly Barker's grade 7 students also began working on kiln fired, hand painted clay plant markers for the finished gardens.

The project relied heavily on donations and help from countless community members, NGRHS alumni, and businesses both big and small. Without this support, we would not have been able to get this project off the ground.

Once the beds were built, we planted tomatoes, peppers, rosemary, chives, sage, thyme, Brussels sprouts, onions, kale, lettuce, peas, radish, cilantro, mesclun mix, potatoes, dill, beans, and spinach.

Throughout the summer, staff volunteers have helped me keep the gardens watered and weeded. A big thanks to Christine Delong (and her mom), Janet Slauenwhite, Terri Foster, and Marlene Blezy for their help.

Also during the summer, we entered the Kent Community Garden Contest. We were selected along with thirteen other garden projects across Nova Scotia to be in the contest. After some close vote races and some phenomenal support from people near and far, we won the contest with over thirteen hundred votes. We will be using the prize money to hopefully expand our garden and possibly build more beds.



Moving forward, we hope to continue to grow this project. Our goal is to increase student involvement and hopefully have more community members become a part of the project as well. We will rely heavily on the continued support of the public and local businesses. It feels great knowing we are providing a valuable learning opportunity for our fantastic students moving forward. Thank you to all who have

supported and continue to support the New Germany Rural High School Garden Project.

Mickie (Florence) Haase created a children's library for the Chester Day School in the 1970's. When that school closed the library collection was re-housed at Mickie's home in East Chester

and named the Carriage House Library. It was open to the public. Mickie financed this endeavour and operated the library for many years with the help of friends. Mickie loved reading and wanted children to have access to books. She was a generous, energetic and passionate librarian who helped many children discover a love for reading.

After Mickie died her children wanted the library to remain in Nova Scotia. The library has been relocated

and renamed. The same collection; the classics, if you will, 'Dr. Seuss', Richard Scarry's 'Busy Town' series, 'Where's Waldo?' and many more are now Butterfly Books. Reconnecting with Ed and Sandra Amos



In Olds, Alberta, a small agricultural college was begun in 1913. Over 100 years later, their record for the oldest graduate to walk their stage was broken. In 2018, Ed Amos, at 83, received a Certificate in Agronomy (the science of soil management and crop production).

Ed and his wife, Sandra, had 'retired' and left our area in 2011 after 34 years of farming at Maple Grove Farm in Farmington. Their new home is in Didsbury, AB. The move to Alberta enables them to more easily spend time with their grown up children and their growing number of grandchildren. Jennifer lives in Medicine Hat with her husband, Mike, and two children. She works as a safety officer for Canada Fertilizer. Gordon lives just outside of Sundre, Alberta with his wife, Jessi, and their four children. Gordon has his own business, Amos Landworks, owner operator of heavy equipment.

Not much sitting on a rocking chair for either of this retired couple. Sandra soon worked the growing season on at a nearby retail greenhouse. Ed began

working part time in Hail Crop insurance. ie assessing damage to crops from hail storms which are very common there. Then Ed saw the opportunity to work toward a Certificate in Agronomy.

Sandra, originally from Shelburne County, NS and Ed, who grew up in Hamilton, ON met on Vancouver Island through mutual friends in the early 70's. Sandra was working as an X-ray technician and Ed was in the navy which he had joined when he was 17. They were married in 1973. Ed continued for a few more years in the navy, spending much time away from home. After 22½ years of service, they decided it was time for a change. And a change they made! Looking across the country for a place to farm, they selected Farmington as their best option and moved here in 1977.



Maple Grove Farm was begun. There were many challenges, hard work, early mornings, long hours, changing plans. There were also many joys, exciting discoveries, great community involvement and many new friends made in the process. It was no small challenge to turn fields into gardens, to get the right mix of outdoor gardens and greenhouses, to find out what would sell where, to get equipment and supplies when it was needed, to find and develop markets, to get produce to markets. And all this with two small children, Jennifer and Gordon. Fortunately, Ed's parents, Andrew and Alice were also up for the move to Nova Scotia and offered two extra pairs of hands and moral support to the mix.

Ed and Sandra were on the ground floor of much of the farm market development in the province. They did markets in many places including the city, Bridgewater and Hubbards. They were founding members of the Lunenburg Farm Market which continues to thrive. For a number of years, they operated their own markets in Bridgewater and West Northfield. They produced a wide range of vegetables – like

beans, peas, carrots, potatoes, squash, broccoli, cauliflower, and then they added flowers and seedlings to their line.

There was time for community involvement as well. They enjoyed the Parkdale-Maplewood community events, they became members of St John-in-the-Wilderness Anglican Church, participated in associations and boards which promoted and supported agriculture. Ed was active with Hillcrest Masonic Lodge in New Germany and served a term as District Deputy Grand Master. Jennifer and Gordon were both students at our New Germany schools, active in 4-H and the Jr Choir at church. Jennifer tried gymnastics and Gordon, Cubs and Scouts.

Through many of these years, they employed up to 15 employees at any one time. Many of them have become life-long friends. Many colleagues and customers, as well, stay in touch.
